

This year we are very pleased to welcome M&M Theatrical Productions to our school on Wednesday 18th October, with their pantomime 'Jack and The Beanstalk'. Due to the rising costs of transport, we have decided to keep the pantomime inhouse this year. The cost will be £6.00 per child and payment should be made on ParentPay between now and the 18th October 2023.

ParentPay Issues

We have had some telephone calls from parents with regards to issues with ParentPay and with payments coming out of their bank accounts in lump amounts. I have contacted ParentPay and they have given the following solution:

When a user wants to add payments to items, they have two choices, One Click payment or to add the item to their basket for the checkout. At the checkout, the user has the choice between one click payment and 'Other Payment'. If they select other payment this will then take them to a visa secure card checkout, where they can make a normal card payment.

Unfortunately, this is how the payer account is currently designed and cannot be amended to remove the one click payment option.

My understanding from this is that parents should be selecting 'other payment' at the checkout to avoid payments being lumped together and taken as a larger amount from their bank accounts.

I hope this resolves any issues you may be having with your ParentPay account.



Child Protection and Safeguarding

In St. MacNissi's, we aim to work closely with parents/guardians in supporting all aspects of their child's development and well-being. Any concerns a parent may have will be taken seriously and dealt with in a professional and confidential manner. Should you have a safeguarding concern, please follow the steps below.



Nut Allergies

We have several children in school who suffer from nut and other allergies. It is important that there is strict avoidance to this food group in order to prevent a life-threatening allergic reaction. Consequently, we must ask that you do not send nuts or nut products into school (either for healthy break or packed lunch). This includes peanut paste, Nutella, all nuts and cooking oil containing peanut oil, as well as foods containing nuts such as cereals and muesli bars. This is particularly relevant now that children are eating lunches in their classrooms. Thank you for your co-operation in this matter.

Some people, especially those allergic to peanuts, may have allergic reactions after eating lupin or foods containing ingredients from lupin

Our school catering team have requested that parents advise if their child has an allergy related to this.
